## WHAT IS FAMILY AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

Any behaviour that is violent, controlling or intended to make you or your family feel scared including abuse that is:



- Physical
- Verbal
- Sexual
- Social Media
- Social
- Stalking
- Cultural
- Financial
- Emotional
- Isolation

## FAMILY AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN PUBLIC - WHAT YOU CAN DO

What can you do if you see Family and Domestic Violence in public?

The first thing to do is always keep yourself safe - these are some suggestions of how you can help

**REPORT: Violence is a crime and the Police encourage you to call TRIPLE ZERO (000) if you see an incident in public. If you are unsure about the urgency the 000 responder will determine the urgency of the situation. You can remain anonymous.**



Don't assume someone else has reported it. If there are children involved or there are weapons involved please notify the Police.

**If the situation escalates call 000 again and update the Police.**



If it is safe- be a witness for the victim. Make your presence known. If it is safe- speak to the person, ask them to stop and tell them you will call the police.



Get help from nearby business owners, security guards and others. Support the person who is being abused - If it is safe! Ask them if they are okay. Offer to call an Ambulance or Police. Listen to them and if needed, refer them to agencies that can help.



What to include in a Police Report

- Where** (location, address)
- When** (time, date)
- What** (what is happening)
- Who** (who is involved, description of people, clothing etc)
- Other** (is there anything else police should know, license plate, does the person have a weapon, are there any children nearby)
